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Lessons from the Journey of *al-Israa*Relief after Hardships

All praise is due to Allah, the Lord of all worlds, Who says in His Ever Glorious Book to His Prophet, "Glory to Him who made His servant travel by night from the sacred place of worship to Al-Aqsa Mosque, whose surroundings We have blessed, to show him some of Our signs: He alone is the All Hearing, the All Seeing." I bear witness that there is no god but Allah, and that Muhammad is His Servant and Messenger. May Allah's Peace and Blessings be upon him, his Household, Companions and upon those who follow their path to the Day of Judgment.

Undoubtedly, al-Israa wa al-Mi 'raj holds a distinctive place in the history of humanity. This remarkable journey remains etched in the collective consciousness of the Muslim Ummah, for it served as a momentous occasion that bestowed honor upon the seal of all Prophets and Messengers, and provided relief for him (PBUH) after the harms inflicted upon him by his people. Following the immense suffering endured by the Prophet (PBUH) at the hands of the polytheists of Mecca due to his divine message and the subsequent persecution he faced, he (PBUH) went out to al-Ta'if area hoping to find support amongst its inhabitants. Regrettably, the people of al-Ta'if proved even crueler as they instigated their slaves and children to pelt him with stones until his noble feet bled.

In this dire moment, the Prophet (PBUH) beseeched the Almighty Allah with the well-known supplication, saying, "O Allah, I appeal to You for the weakness in my strength and my limited power and the treatment of disrespect and humiliation I made to receive. To You, the Most Merciful of all the merciful ones, You are the Lord of the oppressed, and You are my Lord. Under whose care are You leaving me to? To an enemy oppressing me? Or to a friend You have given control of my affair? If there is no anger from You on me I will forever be content. However, Your blessing is vastly important for me I seek refuge with the glory of Your Light which the heavens and earth are lit form, Your anger will not befall on me, nor Your displeasure descends on me. To You is the supplication until You are pleased and there is no control or power except by You."

At this difficult time, our Prophet (PBUH) lost those who used to console him and alleviate his pains, when his wife, the mother of the believers, Khadija bint Khuwailid (may Allah be pleased with her) passed away, and she was his supporter. Also, Our Prophet (PBUH) lost his uncle Abu Talib, who used to defend him due to his high status among the tribes. All these events occurred at one year, which therefore came to be known as "Year of Grief."

These events impart upon us a profound lesson derived from the journey of *al-Isra and al-Mi'raj*. This lesson elucidates the fact that hardship is often followed by ease, and distress is succeeded by relief. Throughout one's life, trials are accompanied by blessings, and victory is attained through patience. The miracle of *al-Israa wa al-Mi'raj* came in the midst of these difficult circumstances and harsh troubles that the Prophet (PBUH) faced to manifest the mercy of the Almighty Allah to His Prophet (PBUH). Thus, that journey was telling the Prophet (PBUH) that if some of the people of the earth have failed him and turned their backs to him, he was shown love by the Lord of the earth and heaven. Thus, the miracle of *al-Isra and al-*

Mi'raj came to relieve his pains, console him (PBUH) and to honor him and his nation. Therefore the poet said:

(O Prophet!) You traveled over night from one sacred place to another, as the full moon travels (at night) through intense darkness.

And you continued ascending (overnight) until you reached (your) destination, (which is), so close (to Allah) which is never been attained nor sought (by any other prophet).

And you were preferred (to lead other prophets in prayer), by all prophets and messenger,

just as a preference given by (a) servant to (his) master.

During the journey of *al-Isra and al-Mi'raj*, our Prophet (PBUH) had the noble chance to ascend to the Lord of the Worlds Who chose him from among all creatures to honor him for his patience, struggle and endurance of adversities, and to let him know somethings from the world of the unseen. This is a great blessing and a great bounty. It is also a great lesson for everyone who suffers adversities and tribulations, that if he continues to be patient, the Almighty Allah will honor him with divine grants and divine giving.

All praise is due to Allah, Lord of the Worlds; may Allah's Peace and Blessings be upon Prophet Muhammad (PBUH), his companions and followers:

The Glorious Qur'an and the Sunnah of the Prophet (PBUH) are full of hope and optimism. With hardship comes ease, and with difficulty comes relief. Therefore, Hence, no matter how difficult the challenges may appear, one must never succumb to despair. When plagued by illness, one should reflect upon the divine grace bestowed upon the Prophet Job (PBUH) by the Almighty Allah, Who alleviated his suffering, cured him of his disease, and answered his supplications. The Almighty Allah says, "Remember Job, when he cried to his Lord, 'Suffering has truly afflicted me, but you are the Most Merciful of the merciful. We answered him, removed his suffering, and restored his family to him, along with more like them, as an act of grace from Us and a reminder for all who serve Us."

Similarly, in times of distress, one should recall the instance when the Almighty Allah relieved the tribulations of His Prophet Jonah (PBUH) and rescued him from the depths of the sea and the belly of the whale. Thus, hardship turned into ease, and the distress turned into relief. The Almighty Allah says, "And remember the man with the whale, when he went off angrily, thinking We could not restrict him, but then he cried out in the deep darkness, 'There is no God but You, glory be to You, I was wrong. We answered him and saved him from distress: this is how We save the faithful." And if you are poor or needy, know that no soul will die until it has fulfilled its lifespan and sustenance, and have trust in the grace and generosity of Allah, as the Almighty Allah says, "There is not a creature that moves on earth whose provision is not His concern. He knows where it lives and its [final] resting place: it is all [there] in a clear record."

O Allah, fill our hearts with tranquility and contentment.
